****RULES FOR PRODUCE CONTEST****

1. Entries will be accepted:
Thursday, September 6: 6:00 – 10:00 pm
Friday, September 7: 7:30 – 9:00 am.
2. Exhibitor must legibly print the name and variety of each entry on a supplied entry card with the correct number of entries on each plate.
3. Judging will begin at 9:00 am on Friday (9/7). Public not allowed in the Produce Tent during judging. The tent will reopen as soon as possible after 12 noon
4. The exhibitor must grow all entries.
5. All entries become the property of the Yorktown Grange Fair.
6. Each entry will be judged independently and according to the standard of excellence for that particular variety. It is important that your entry is correctly named as to species and variety. The judges will also be looking for table quality, and uniformity in color and size, not oversized or over-ripe. Please: Read descriptions in seed catalogs and on seed packets.
7. Entries should be cleaned but not polished.
8. Decision of the judges is final.
9. Containers used in special collections must be picked up between 6 to 7 pm on Sunday. They should be labeled with your name if you are picking them up. We are not responsible for any containers that are lost or damaged.
10. Ribbons and awards may be picked up in the Produce tent between 6 to 8 pm Sunday (9/9).

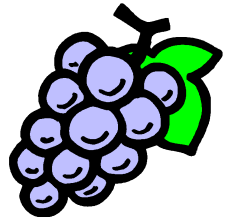

3	Beets (trim tops to 1"0)
1	Broccoli head
1	Broccoli, small heads in a bunch 5" in diameter
5	Brussels Sprouts
1	Cabbage (head)
3	Carrots (trim tops to 1")
1	Celery (bunch)
3	Ears of Corn
2	Cucumbers
1	Eggplant



- 1 Endive
- 1 Kale, complete plant
- 3 Kohlrabi
- 3 Leeks, leaves trimmed
- 1 Lettuce (head)
- 5 Crabapples, Plums or Figs
- 3 Apples, Pears, Peaches, Quinces, Nectarines
- 5 Strawberries or other berries
- 1 Bunch of Grapes (white, red or black)
- 1 Melon
- 3 Okra
- 3 Onions
- 3 Parsnips (trim tops to 1")

- 3 Standard Tomatoes, all ripe or all unripe

- Judged on quality, quantity, and artistic arrangement.
- Blue Ribbon winner receives a \$25.00 gift certificate.



Class B. Organic Garden Collection

- For the gardener who practices organic gardening
- Judged on number of varieties and quality.
- Blue Ribbon winner receives a \$25.00 gift certificate

Class C. A Collection of Gourds

- Judged on number of varieties and quality.
- Blue Ribbon winner receives a \$25.00 gift certificate

Class D. Novelty corner

- For the garden freak or novelty
- Winner receives a Blue Ribbon

Class E. Biggest Pumpkin of 2018

- The "BIGGEST" Pumpkin is determined by weight.
- Special Ribbon winner receives a \$25.00 gift certificate.
